Design Award Entry Information

OVERVIEW:

The 2017 Design Awards Program recognizes excellence in design by the architectural profession and is presented by AIA Fort Lauderdale, a Chapter of the American Institute of Architects. These Awards are intended to promote public consciousness of the built environment through distinguished works of architecture by our local membership.

The submittals are open to built or unbuilt architectural projects of all types and sizes, and can be submitted by individuals or firms that are members of our local chapter or AIAS in a Broward County university or college and practices in Broward County. All designs must have been produced within the past six years.

The awards are juried by a panel of non-competing, award-winning, architects who are not members of AIA Fort Lauderdale and have not served as design awards jurors for at least the past 6 years. Multiple Honor and Merit Awards may be awarded in each category as entries are solely and individually weighted on their value of design excellence and technical rigor. However, only one project will be awarded the top award. This year's jury includes: Donald Yoshino, FAIA (chair), Vicki Soderland, AIA, and Mikael Kaul, AIA.

Winners will be announced at The Design Awards dinner to be held at the Hyatt Regency Pier 66 on October 5th at 6pm.

ARCHITECT CATEGORIES

SUSTAINABLE DESIGN AWARD

This category recognizes projects that demonstrate excellence in sustainable design.

UN-BUILT PROJECT OF THE YEAR

Includes public and private projects that are not built

DISTINCTIVE DETAIL

The creation and implementation of outstanding details is often not given the recognition it deserves. These submissions should be of a detail that can stand by itself or make a building. A submission for this award must be an element or composition of elements within a built project that is integral to that project.

RENOVATION CATEGORY

Includes built preservation, adaptive re-use, or renovations of structures.

URBAN DESIGN CATEGORY

Includes transportation, parks and recreation, or city and community planning projects.

SMALL INSTITUTIONAL

Includes built public non-residential projects under 25,000 sf

LARGE INSTITUTIONAL

Includes built public non-residential over 25,000 sf

SMALL COMMERCIAL

Includes built private non-residential under 25,000 sf

LARGE COMMERCIAL

Includes built private non-residential over 25,000 sf

RESIDENTIAL

Include built single and multi-family residences

FIRM OF THE YEAR

This award will be given in recognition of a firm that displays excellence in design, mentorship of architects, community service, and support to AIA Fort Lauderdale during the 2016 – 2017 calendar year (August to August). To demonstrate this the firm shall submit active or completed projects within this timeline, examples of process set up for mentorship and/or professional growth of architects within the firm, community service involvement, and demonstration of support of the AIA Fort Lauderdale Chapter through participation of staff and financial support.

ARCHITECT/DESIGNER OF THE YEAR

This award will be given in recognition of a licensed Architect that has worked in Broward County for at least the past 5 consecutive years that displays excellence in design and architecture. Active and completed projects designed by this individual within the last 5 consecutive years shall be submitted for judging.

NEW THIS YEAR! Any submission to the design awards will be eligible for two new award categories: The People's Choice Award and the AIA Fort Lauderdale Executive Board's Honor Award. These awards will be chosen outside of the jury. The People's Choice Award will be voted on by peers attending the Design Awards Gala and awarded later that evening. The AIA Fort Lauderdale Executive Board's Honor Award will be judged and awarded by the board and presented at the Design Awards Gala.

CONTRACTOR CATEGORIES

These categories recognize projects that demonstrate excellence in design implementation by a General Contractor. ***For any projects submitted within the Contractor Categories it is required that the submission be entered by an architect who is a member or contractor that is an allied member of AIA Fort Lauderdale. The submitting architect should be an individual that acted as client representative, local firm team member or project manager having direct involvement on the project. A maximum of one award in each category will be given.***

INSTITUTIONAL

Includes built public non-residential

COMMERCIAL

Includes built private non-residential

RESIDENTIAL

Include built single and multi-family residences

SERVICE AWARDS

Community Service Award

This award is given to recognize an AIA Ft. Lauderdale Architect whose leadership in community activities and service has been a direct benefit to the profession or community.

The individual's leadership and service must demonstrate, beyond any reasonable doubt, qualities, outcomes in works of art, programs or civic influences that have benefited the profession or the community.

Government Service Award

This award is given to an AIA Ft Lauderdale Architect who, by their interest, activity and concern for the profession of architecture, shall have advanced the cause of good design and planning, and/or contributed to the dignity and value of the architectural profession as an elected or appointed or employed government official/employee.

AIA Service Gold Medal Award

This award recognizes an individual architect in Broward County who has distinguished himself or herself in a manner resulting in a profound impact on the profession over an extended period of time. This is the highest award that AIA Ft. Lauderdale can bestow on one of its members and only one may be given in a year. Any individual who has been a member of AIA for a minimum of 10 years is eligible. The individual's long-term, noteworthy accomplishments in the AIA, as well as community organizations or governmental bodies, must demonstrate distinguishable results characterizing one's career in a manner over and above what is normally expected.

Educator of the Year Award

This award will be given in recognition of an educator in Broward County whose outstanding performance has made a significant contribution to the advancement of architectural education through college or university teaching. Nominations may be made by any AIA Ft. Lauderdale Chapter member. Individuals may not nominate themselves.

Associate Member Individual Honor Award

The Associate Member Individual Honor Award recognizes an associate member whose leadership, activities and service to AIA Ft. Lauderdale have been a direct benefit to the profession.

Allied Member of the Year Award

This award recognizes an Allied Member who is not an architect, but who, by their interest, participation and concern, has promoted and contributed to the dignity and value of AIA Ft. Lauderdale and the architectural profession.

STUDENT CATEGORY

This award recognizes built or unbuilt or competition projects by college students attending a school of architecture program within our chapter territory or whose permanent residence is within our area. Entries are to be submitted using the provided PowerPoint template and delivered to the chapter via email to events@aiafortlauderdale.org by the required deadline. Maximum file size must not exceed 10 MB.

ARCHITECT CATEGORIES entry fees:

Entry Fees: AIA Member - \$100.00 for the first submittal and \$50 for each additional submittal
Non - Member - \$250.00 per submittal
All entry fees are non-refundable

Student CATEGORIES entry fees:

Entry Fee: \$50.00 (Entry fee includes one free admission to design awards reception.)
All entry fees are non-refundable

Registration

Registration and fees are due by 5:00 p.m. on August 24, 2017. Online registration is available by going to our web site at www.aiafortlauderdale.org, under events.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All entries must be completed within the PowerPoint template provided. Entries shall be submitted using the provided template and delivered to the chapter via email provided on registration by the required deadline. Maximum file size must not exceed 10 MB. Also required for all categories is a 30"x42" poster of project to be used in exhibition the evening of Gala. The poster is required component of this year's submission process as it is used in the People's Choice Award judging. All posters will be displayed within a public exhibition at a later date and venue to be determined. The public exhibition is intended to celebrate the work of Broward County Architects. The 2017 Design Awards logo will be sent to you upon registration and is to be included on the poster and within the PowerPoint. They are also available on the chapter website, design award page.
